**Itinerary from Soccer City Cape Town to Soccer City Port Elizabeth**

**Days 1 to 5 Cape Town, the Mother-City**

Upon arrival at Cape Town International Airport drive to your accommodation on the Cape Peninsula. Cape Town is the oldest city and developed into a buzzing metropolis that is stretching out from the foot of Table Mountain to the busy harbour of Table Bay.

The Green Point Stadium with its 64'000 seats has been newly built to host some of the matches of the Soccer World Cup in 2010!

If you hold tickets for the matches in Cape Town on 11, 14, 18, 21, 24 or 29 of June we are happy to arrange one of the various tour examples of the above table for you.

Enjoy the city with its many popular sights: Company Gardens, Bo Kaap Quarter, District Six, The Castle, Table Mountain, the close beaches of Camp's Bay, Clifton, the little fishing village Hout Bay (embark on a boat cruise to Seal Island from here). Other musts are:

- V&A Waterfront – and Victoria Mall, the many bistros and restaurants
- The Two Oceans Aquarium (looking for some adrenalin...then climb into the shark's tank and dive with them!)
- Robben Island
- Drive around the beautiful Cape Peninsula to the most south-westerly point of the continent: visit Cape of Good Hope and the lighthouse of Cape Point
- Stop at the Ostrich farm close to Cape Point
- Visit the Penguin Colony at Boulders Beach, near Simon's Town.
- Pop into Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens
- Ascent Table Mountain (either take one of the various hiking trails or the cable car)
- You want something thrilling? Embark on a helicopter and tour the Cape Peninsula (heli flips from 15 to 30 Minutes and longer)
- Sail on a catamaran in the waters of Table Bay
- Visit the Cape Winelands and follow the wine routes, go on a cellar tour and taste the popular Cape Wines...

**4 overnights in Cape Town / Cape Peninsula**

## **Days 5 + 6 Hermanus – Stanford - Gansbaai**

Leave the mother city and start your tour along the beautiful coastal road along False Bay, passing the small villages, Gordon's Bay, Pringle Bay, Betty's Bay and continue to the little fishing village of Hermanus on Walker Bay. Every year between the months of July and November the Southern Right Whales come to the Cape of South Africa looking for protected waters such as Walker Bay to calf and bring up their youngsters. Some whales never leave the Cape, so you might be lucky and see some "permanent inhabitants" from the cliff path that leads all along the bay.

Things to do in and around Hermanus:

- in Hermanus: visit Fernkloof Nature Reserve
- stroll along the little shops and find some souvenirs on the local craft market
- visit Stanford some 25km from Hermanus, a little arty village, go into a local Pub and maybe watch one of the soccer matches with the locals
- close to Stanford you can try some fresh beer at Birkenhead Brewery, also close by is a cheese farm
- drive to Gansbaai for a shark cage diving experience or just the boat trip with the divers – you will see many Cape Fur Seals (one of the biggest colonies worldwide), various sea birds and maybe even whales...

### **2 overnights in Hermanus area**

## **Days 7 + 8 Along the Garden Route to Knysna and Knysna Lagoon**

Continue on the Garden Route to the city of Knysna – famous for its setting overlooking the Knysna Lagoon up to the Knysna Heads, two high cliffs that are forming the entrance from the lagoon into the Indian Ocean. Knysna has a lot to offer:

- try fresh Oysters on Thesen Island
- take the boat to the Western Knysna Head into Featherbed Nature Reserve or
- embark a catamaran and set sail for a lagoon sunset cruise!
- Drive to Plettenberg Bay and visit Monkeyland, Birds of Eden and Tenikwa Wildlife Awareness Center.
- simply stroll along the main road, visit local craft markets, the little mall and Knysna Waterfront with its nice shops and restaurants...

### **2 overnights in Knysna area**

## **Day 9 + 10 Tsitsikamma and more of the Garden Route**

After a morning safari and leisurely breakfast continue along the spectacular Garden Route. This route owes her name to the scenic beauty next to it: the Indian Ocean with either soft white beaches or cliffs on the one side and the mountain range on the inland side. One of the highlights is the gigantic Storms River Mouth that can be admired from the bridge.

Things to do:

- visit Tsitsikamma National Park
- Canopy Tree Top Tour: glide through the Tsitsikamma Yellow Wood Forest in approximately 30 m heights – a bit of adventure on this very particular way of exploring this area (no experience needed).
- The highest Bungee Jump worldwide from Bloukrans Bridge
- long beach walks and much more...

## **Day 11 Port Elizabeth**

If you hold tickets for matches on either 21, 26 June or 2 July stop over in soccer city Port Elizabeth, which is also called the "friendly city". Explore the city and breathe some more soccer atmosphere.

## **Day 11 + 12 Addo Elephant Park/South African National Parks**

If you hold tickets for the matches scheduled for 23 June, 02 or 10 July you continue via Port Elizabeth straight to malaria-free Addo Elephant Park for your safari experience. Escape into a completely different world: the park is a sanctuary comprising 164'000 ha, a finely tuned ecosystem which is home to over 450 elephants, Cape buffalo, black rhino, a variety of antelope species, as well as the unique flightless dung beetle, found almost exclusively in Addo. Your accommodation will be close to Addo Elephant Park. Go on a late afternoon safari watching out for wildlife, their tracks and smell the bush. On the next day enjoy a pick nick on one of the elevated look out points in the park. South African National Parks also offers game drives in an open game vehicle accompanied by a local ranger who explains and tracks down the game with you – we can assist booking a game drive for you. Your accommodation will be close to the Park.

### **2 overnights in Addo area**

## **Day 13 Soccer in Port Elizabeth**

Check out and drive the last 1h30 on your trip to your final destination Port Elizabeth. After a stroll along one of the beaches, visit the soccer stadium at Nelson Mandela Bay and get all drawn into the soccer spirit! One of the highlights of the trip is certainly the soccer match on either 23 June, 02 or 10 July.

Depending on your homebound flight proceed to Port Elizabeth Airport and fly either to Cape Town or Johannesburg to connect with your international flight.
